## 15 women entrepreneurs selected for Zone Startups India's empoWer accelerator programme

CHENNAI: Fifteen women entrepreneurs have been selected by Zone Startups India for its "empoWer" accelerator programme for women entrepreneurs in tech businesses.

The 'empoWer' initiative, launched in April 2016, is backed by department of science and technology, GIZ, Vodafone India, Google, Nishith Desai Associates, and SheEO (a Toronto-based women entrepreneur support organisation).

Zone Startups India received 181 applications from women entrepreneurs across India.

After a competitive selection process, involving application evaluation and personal interviews by the programme advisors from India and Canada, 15 women entrepreneurs have been selected for the six weeks bespoke programme.

The programme will comprise mentoring sessions, workshops, industry connects, case studies of successful women led startups, peer-to-peer and investor connects.

A sum of over Rs 60 lakh in cash and professional services is being extended to the top performers.

Ajay Ramasubramaniam, director, Zone Startups India, "We felt that it was the right time to do an accelerator program focused, given the buzz in the ecosystem and the media, around women founders. With this programme, we aim at enabling women entrepreneurs build a strong peer network, as well as help broaden their network - which seem to be 2 major issues affecting a lot of women entrepreneurs. More importantly, with this programme, we believe that we can create women leaders with great business skills."

The following 15 startup founders have been selected for the 6 weeks bespoke programme.
